We have settled very well into Term 3 in our lovely classroom. On the whole, students are very comfortable and excited to complete their tasks each day.

Our goal setting each day has helped us to concentrate on behaviours that will 'Make Wooroolin Proud'. Some students are feeling so confident about their behaviours that they are setting more than one goal each day and are achieving them and getting their shiny sticker!!

During our Literacy Block we now have a great routine for completing our PLD (Spelling) session each day, and most students are able to work independently on activities that reinforce their spelling learning. We have been reading the Pigeon Books by Mo Willems to help us learn about writing Persuasive Texts and have written some awesome sentences using persuasive sentence starters.

Each day in our Numeracy Block we have been concentrating very hard on our number facts. All students have their own Number Facts Folder and complete their facts as independently as possible before using one of Mrs J's colourful pens to mark them with a calculator. Everyone loves this time of the day. The Preppies have been working on ordering numbers and the Year 2 and 3's have been experimenting with fractions. Everyone has been looking at 2D and 3D shapes.

Yr 4-6 News

Well done to the whole class for your efforts in upgrading our school gardens! The students have been working in small groups across different areas. They have been watering, weeding, and planting new plants purchased from Bunnings and Ramesa Nursery.

English: We have been busy learning about the effective structure of sentences, paragraphs, and the use of persuasive devices. Next week, we will closely examine what students need to include in their written texts to achieve their goals.

Mathematics: On Monday, Thursday, and Friday, we have been exploring concepts of length, mass, and capacity. By the end of next week, students will be ready to be assessed on these topics. Year 6 students will also need to demonstrate their ability to convert between measurements, which they have been practising for homework. On Tuesday and Wednesday, we are focusing on number concepts for this term, including fractions, decimals, and percentages.

HASS: Students have continued to explore the climate of our area and how it affects the way we live. They have investigated which crops are best suited to our region and why, as well as the natural areas we can visit.
