Prep/Yr 3 News

Welcome back to Term 3! I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday and ready for our new learning this term! Students have kick started the term will some new learning! In English, students have started exploring informative texts and will be learning particular text and language features over the next few weeks, in preparation for Part A of their assessment. In Part B, students will be creating their own information report. In Maths, this term students will cover the topics; measurement, shapes and place value. In Science P-2 students are learning all about light and sound! Students have completed their first lesson on this topic and will be exploring instruments and toys involving the sound they make. For our Literacy Hour, students are enjoying spelling, reading and writing rotations every morning. Students are working to achieve their next level by the end of term. We have had a productive start and we are very excited to get into learning more and more about our fun and new learning this term.

Yr 4 – 6 News

Welcome back to another exciting term of learning. I hope you and your family had some memorable moments over the holidays. We have already been busy commencing our new units, so that we can spread the learning and assessment over the whole term. This helps students who are regularly attending school to not become overwhelmed by their assessment tasks. Yesterday students spent the afternoon reflecting on their achievements of last term and looking at expectations needed to be successful in English and Mathematics. They then wrote goals for reading, writing, mathematics and for overall learning. Please have a conversation with your child about these and ask them regularly how they are going.

In **English** this term in the first task students will need to read and examine different styles of information texts about animal. They will need to compare the text features (text structures, language features and visual features) of the two texts.

Mathematics: Please make sure that your child is spending time at home working on their number facts focus. Quick recall of multiplication and division facts is an important skill for them to be successful in assessment this term. *Year 4* will be learning: To recall multiplication and division facts and solve problems using appropriate strategies for multiplication and division. To use scaled instruments to measure temperature, lengths, shapes and objects. *Year 5* will be learning: To investigate factors and multiples, solve problems using the four operations, and use estimation and rounding to check reasonableness of answers. To choose appropriate units of measurement for length, area, volume, capacity and mass. To calculate perimeter and area of rectangles. *Year 6* will be learning: To write correct number sentences using brackets and order of operation, and solve problems using the four operations. To convert between units of measurement and solve measurement problems with decimals. To explain reasoning and understanding related to measurement problems.

Instrumental lessons are on Tuesday afternoon. Please help remind your child to have their instrument at school on this day, as several students have been forgetting.
